## Overview of the public participation report

The Public participation plays a critical role in intensifying democracy, citizen's involvement in governance processes and also promoting good governance in the society.

The County Government of Mandera seeks to formulate the revenue raising measures and widens the County tax base by regulating various revenue collections and administration measures within the purview of its powers and functions.

The principal objective of this Bill is to give effects to Article 209 (3) and part 2 of Fourth Schedule of the Constitution 2010, and provide for the general administration, collection of certain levies and fees, enforcement of the laws relating to revenue raising measures in the County.

Additionally, the Constitution requires the County Government to take legislative and administrative measures to ensure that revenue raising measures adhere to the principles of financial management as contemplated under Article 201 of COK, 2010 and section 132 (3) of the PFM Act, 2012. Thus the Mandera County Finance Bill, 2025 seeks to establish a legal framework to facilitate this process which will authorize the raising of County revenues.

The department of revenue conducted a public participation fora and stakeholder engagement in six major sub-counties of Mandera county on Monday the 12th May, 2025 whereby views and proposals on the Bill were documented.

In fulfillment of this legal obligation, the department of revenue placed an advert vide the Standard newspaper(**attached**) dated 9th May, 2025, inviting members of the public and stakeholders to a public participation fora held in six sub-counties of Mandera as per schedule below;

In addition, the members of the public and all other stakeholders were given an opportunity to present their views/comments through a written Memorandum on the County Finance Bill, 2025 to the Office of the Chief Officer Revenue Services, by way of either hand delivery or sent to revenue@mandera.go.ke or before **Thursday 15th May, 2025**

### **Objectives of the Public Participation Forums**

The primary objectives of these public participation forums were to:

**Sensitize the public:** To inform Mandera County residents about the contents and implications of the Finance Bill 2025.

**Gather feedback:** To provide a platform for citizens to express their views, concerns, and suggestions regarding the proposed measures.

**Enhance transparency:** To demonstrate the county government's commitment to an open and accountable financial management process.

**Foster ownership:** To encourage citizens to take an active role in shaping the financial policies that affect their lives.

**Improve the Bill:** To incorporate valuable public input into the final version of the Finance Bill before its enactment by the County Assembly.

### **Key Issues and Feedback Received**

**Proposed Fees and Charges:** A significant portion of the feedback revolved around the proposed fees and charges for various county services, including business permits, market access, and cess on agricultural produce, etc. Concerns were raised about the affordability of these charges, particularly for small-scale traders.

**Taxation Base:** Discussions also centered on the need to broaden the county's revenue tax base to reduce the burden on existing taxpayers. Suggestions included exploring new sources of revenue and improving the efficiency of revenue collection.

**Service Delivery:** Participants often linked their willingness to pay taxes and fees to the quality of services they receive. There were calls for the county government to improve service delivery in key areas such as water provision, healthcare, road infrastructure, and waste management.

**Transparency and Accountability:** Citizens emphasized the importance of transparency in the utilization of collected revenue and called for greater accountability in county spending.

**Impact on Businesses:** Business owners expressed concerns about the potential impact of increased fees and charges on their operations and competitiveness. Some requested a review of the proposed rates to ensure they do not stifle economic growth.

### Recommendations and way forward

**Review of Proposed Fees:** The County Government should carefully review the proposed fees and charges, taking into account the concerns raised about affordability and potential economic impact. A detailed justification for any proposed increases should be provided.

**Explore Revenue Diversification:** Efforts to identify and tap into new revenue streams should be intensified to ensure a more sustainable and equitable revenue base for the county.

**Strengthen Service Delivery:** Concrete measures should be outlined to improve the quality and efficiency of county services in response to the demands of the residents.

**Enhance Transparency and Accountability:** Mechanisms for greater transparency in financial management and accountability in public spending should be strengthened and communicated to the public.

**Engage Businesses:** Further consultations with the business community should be undertaken to address their specific concerns and explore ways to create a conducive business environment.

**Improve Public Participation:** Lessons learned from these forums should be used to enhance the effectiveness and inclusivity of future public participation exercises.

### Conclusion

The public participation forums held on 12th May 2025 provided a valuable platform for the residents of Mandera County to engage with the proposed Finance Bill 2025. The active participation of citizens demonstrates their commitment to the development of the county and their desire to have a say in the policies that affect them. The feedback received will be instrumental in shaping a Finance Bill that is fair, equitable, and responsive to the needs of the people of Mandera County. The County Government is committed to ensuring that the final Bill reflects the aspirations and concerns voiced during this crucial public engagement process.

# Storm at UoN after hiring of new acting VC

► Prof Bitange Ndemo has been named the substantive Vice Chancellor.

► However, a new acting Vice Chancellor has replaced the current one.

Leadership wrangles at the University of Nairobi have deepened following the appointment of an acting vice chancellor on Thursday.

Council Chairman Amukowa Anangwe announced Prof Francis Jackim Mulaa as acting Vice Chancellor for a six-month period starting May 5, 2025. Prof Mulaa replaces Prof Margaret Jesang Hutchinson, whose term as acting VC ended this week.

This comes after it emerged that Education Cabinet Secretary Julius Ogamba extended the term for Prof Hutchinson, as acting VC.

Sources at the university revealed that Prof Hutchinson further appointed two deputy vice chancellors in acting capacities, a matter that angered the council. It emerged that the move by Ogamba to extend the term for Prof Hutchinson prompted Prof Anangwe to appoint Prof Mulaa.

This latest reshuffle adds to the ongoing leadership crisis at the university, which has seen three acting vice chancellors in two years and the expulsion of Prof Stephen Kiama in December.

The instability has raised concerns about succession planning, governance, and political interference at the institution. According to the letter,

Prof Mulaa, who currently serves as Deputy Vice Chancellor in charge of Academic Affairs, was appointed to "preempt an administrative vacuum."

He will serve in an acting capacity until a substantive VC is confirmed. Anangwe also confirmed that Prof Elijah Bitange Ndemo, a former ICT Principal Secretary and current Ambassador to Belgium, had emerged as the top candidate for the vice chancellor position following interviews conducted by the Public Service Commission (PSC).

"The chairperson of the University of Nairobi Council appoints Prof Elijah Bitange Ndemo, as the Vice Chancellor of the University of Nairobi with effect from May 2, 2025, subject to ratification by the council," the letter states. Anangwe added that Ndemo will assume the role once he concludes his diplomatic assignment.

Students welcomed Ndemo's nomination, blaming the Ministry of Education for interfering with the university's internal processes.

Ngetich Soi, a student leader, said UoN has suffered from administrative gaps due to the large number of acting office holders. "The appointment of a substantive VC would restore normalcy and improve service delivery to students," Soi said.

It emerged that after Public Service Commission (PSC) conducted interviews and forwarded the shortlist of candidates to the University Council chairman. Anangwe then wrote to Ogamba requesting permission to hold the special meeting on April 2.

According to the letter, the agenda was to deliberate and appoint the new VC and DVC-AA. However, CS Ogamba declined the request, setting

in motion back and forth correspondence that has threatened to plunge the university into crisis.

In his response dated April 1, Ogamba cited pending investigations into alleged irregularities raised in the Auditor-General's report for the year ending June 30, 2024. "In light of the reported irregularities, we are unable to approve the proposed special meeting, pending further review and investigation. The council will be ad-

vised appropriately once the review is complete," Ogamba wrote.

Insiders at the university however termed as baseless, the argument fronted by Ogamba on declining to grant special council meeting. "Audit queries are done for all parastatals in Kenya and then institutions are called to defend themselves at the parliamentary committee. There is nothing like operations being stopped in any institution until Public Investment Committee (PIC) finishes its work. Ogamba can't judge on an incomplete a PIC matter," said a council member.

The refusal, came just a day before a planned meeting, sparked allegations that the Ministry of Education was interfering with the university's internal affairs to influence the appointment of next Vice Chancellor.

Ogamba would later dissolve the university governing council, through a Gazette Notice, revoking the appointments of four council members who includes Sally Toroitich, Ahmed Abdullahi, Parmain Ole Narikae, and Carren Kerubo Omwenga.

Their sudden removal left the Council without quorum, effectively paralysing operations. In a letter dated May 2, 2025 and addressed to Ogamba, the university's council chairperson Amukowa Anangwe announced that Ndemo had scored the highest in the recruitment process conducted by PSC, making him the leading nominee for the VC position.

According to the letter seen by *The Standard*, Ndemo emerged top in a PSC merit list with a score of 84 per cent, ahead of Prof Duke Orata (73 per cent) and Prof Francis Jackim Mulaa (66.7 per cent).

## Police reservist convicted of murder of teacher in 2022

The High Court in Kabarnet has convicted a National Police Reservist following a banditry attack which led to the death of a teacher three years ago.

Justice Rachel Ngetich convicted Wilson Chebii of killing Wycliffe Simotwo on May 1, 2022, at Terrain, Kinyach in Baringo North.

He ruled that Chebii used a lethal weapon to strike Simotwo several times, and he ought to have known that the injuries inflicted would cause death. "The accused had premeditated his actions. I find that malice aforethought under Section 206 (b) of the Penal Code was proved beyond a reasonable doubt," the judge added.

Ian Chebor testified that on May 1, 2022, he was herding livestock with the teacher and two other people in the forest when bandits raided. At the time, Chebor said the attackers

had guns, but saw the accused following their earlier encounters at Elgeyo Marakwet while grazing. During the raid, Chebor narrowly escaped the gunshots, ran home, and informed his father and villagers about the incident, then went back to the scene after three hours.

At the scene, they found the lifeless body of the teacher on the ground with blood oozing from his hands and legs.

Pius Kiptoo said while herding livestock, with Chebor and two others, he was approached by Chebii inquiring about the whereabouts of his father.

Suddenly, he saw about 20 people who used to graze together, and he went to meet with the others and found them on top of a tree. He learned that Chebii and the attackers had raided and escaped with the livestock.
