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1. INTRODUCTION

The County Government of Mandera, through the Department of Economic Planning and Statistics, conducted public participation forums across all six constituencies to collect citizens' views on the County Annual Development Plan (ADP). The exercise was undertaken in line with Article 10 of the Constitution of Kenya 2010, the County Governments Act, 2012, and the Public Finance Management Act, 2012, which require citizen involvement in county planning and budgeting.

The forums provided an opportunity for residents to identify development priorities, review ongoing projects, and propose interventions for inclusion in the upcoming Annual Development Plan.

2. OBJECTIVES OF THE PUBLIC PARTICIPATION

- Collect citizens' development priorities.
- Validate sector priorities contained in the draft ADP.
- Promote transparency and accountability in county planning.
- Enhance community ownership of county development programmes.
- Ensure equitable allocation of county resources.

A. MANDERA NORTH CONSTITUENCY

Key Issues Raised

- Construction of flood control structures, including floodways and canals along **River Daua** to protect farms and settlements from flooding.

- Ensuring a consistent supply of essential medicines and pharmaceutical commodities to health facilities.

- Construction of housing units for vulnerable households.

- Provision of farm tractors and other mechanization equipment to enhance agricultural productivity.
- Provision of relief food to vulnerable households affected by drought and food insecurity.
- Construction and improvement of access roads to **Dagahley Village**.
- Bush clearing and maintenance of feeder roads leading to **Rhamu** and **Rhamu Dimtu** farming areas.
- Physical planning and land surveying for **Rhamu Town**.
- Construction of dispensaries at **Orahey**, **Mubarak**, and **Dagmarer** to improve access to healthcare services.
- Murraming of the **Rhamu Dimtu–Olla Road** to improve transport and accessibility.
- Expansion of cash transfer programmes for vulnerable households.
- Construction of the **Istanbul–Takaba Road** to enhance regional connectivity and facilitate trade.

Water

- Drilling of additional boreholes.
- Rehabilitation of non-functional boreholes.
- Extension of water pipelines to villages.
- Construction of water pans.

Health

- Upgrade Rhamu Hospital.

- Livestock development.
- Climate change adaptation.
- Improved education facilities.
- Support for persons with disabilities.
- Expansion of electricity and solar street lighting.
- Strengthening disaster preparedness.

5. GENERAL OBSERVATIONS

- Public attendance was satisfactory across all constituencies.
- Women and youth actively participated in discussions.
- Community members appreciated the county's commitment to inclusive planning.
- Citizens requested timely implementation of projects previously proposed.
- Residents emphasized equitable distribution of development projects across wards.

6. CHALLENGES EXPERIENCED

- Long travelling distances for participants.
- High temperatures during meetings.
- Limited time for detailed discussions.
- Poor road accessibility in some areas.
- Inadequate public address systems at some venues.

7. RECOMMENDATIONS

1. Prioritize water development projects countywide.
2. Increase allocation towards health infrastructure and staffing.
3. Improve road connectivity between villages.
4. Enhance youth and women empowerment programmes.
5. Strengthen livestock production and veterinary services.
6. Increase civic education before future public participation exercises.
7. Ensure timely implementation of approved projects.
8. Provide continuous feedback to communities on implementation progress.

8. CONCLUSION

The public participation exercise was successfully conducted across all six constituencies of Mandera County. Residents actively identified priority development needs, which will inform the preparation of the County Annual Development Plan. The exercise demonstrated the County Government's commitment to participatory planning, transparency, and inclusive governance. 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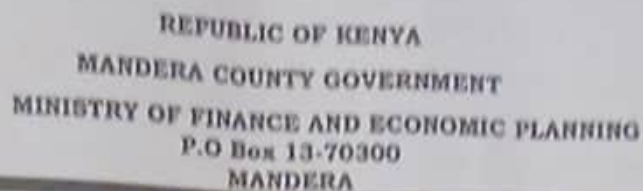
